# Cooking Corner

#### **Sour Cream Cake**

1 C (2 sticks) margarine

1.5 C sugar, plus 3 T

3 eggs

2.5 C flour

3 tsp baking powder

1/2 tsp salt

1/2 tsp baking soda

1/2 tsp vanilla

1 small container of sour cream

4 T cocoa

1 T cinnamon

Preheat oven to 350\*. Grease and flour a tube or bundt pan. Cream margarine and sugar. Add eggs and mix well. Add dry ingredients alternating with sour cream. Add vanilla. In seperate bowl, mix 3 T sugar, 4 T cocoa, and 1 T cinnamon. Pour half of batter in pan, top with half of cocoa mixture. Swirl together. Pour second half of batter, top with remaining cocoa mixture and swirl together. Batter should be thick. Bake for 35-45 minutes, or until toothpick comes out clean.
